Llegó a Buenos Aires con veintiún años acompañada de su hermana Florence, un año menor, en el contingente de Clara Armstrong. Ambas fueron destinadas a San Juan para trabajar junto a la directora Mary Graham. Con sus compañeras de Mendoza cruzaron los Andes en mula, un viaje peligroso y lleno de aventuras que Florence registró en su Diario de Los Andes. En 1886, al regresar a Estados Unidos, Sarah estudió la carrera normalista. Además, fue una activa sufragista y viajó por el mundo representando a su país como traductora.



She arrived in Buenos Aires at the age of twenty-one accompanied by her sister Florence, who was one year younger, as part of Clara Armstrong's contingent of teachers. Both were assigned to San Juan to work alongside its director Mary Graham. With her companions from Mendoza she crossed the Andes on a mule, a dangerous and adventurous journey about which Florence wrote in her Diario de Los Andes. In 1886, upon returning to the United States, she studied to be a teacher. In addition, she was an active suffragette and traveled the world representing her country as a translator.
